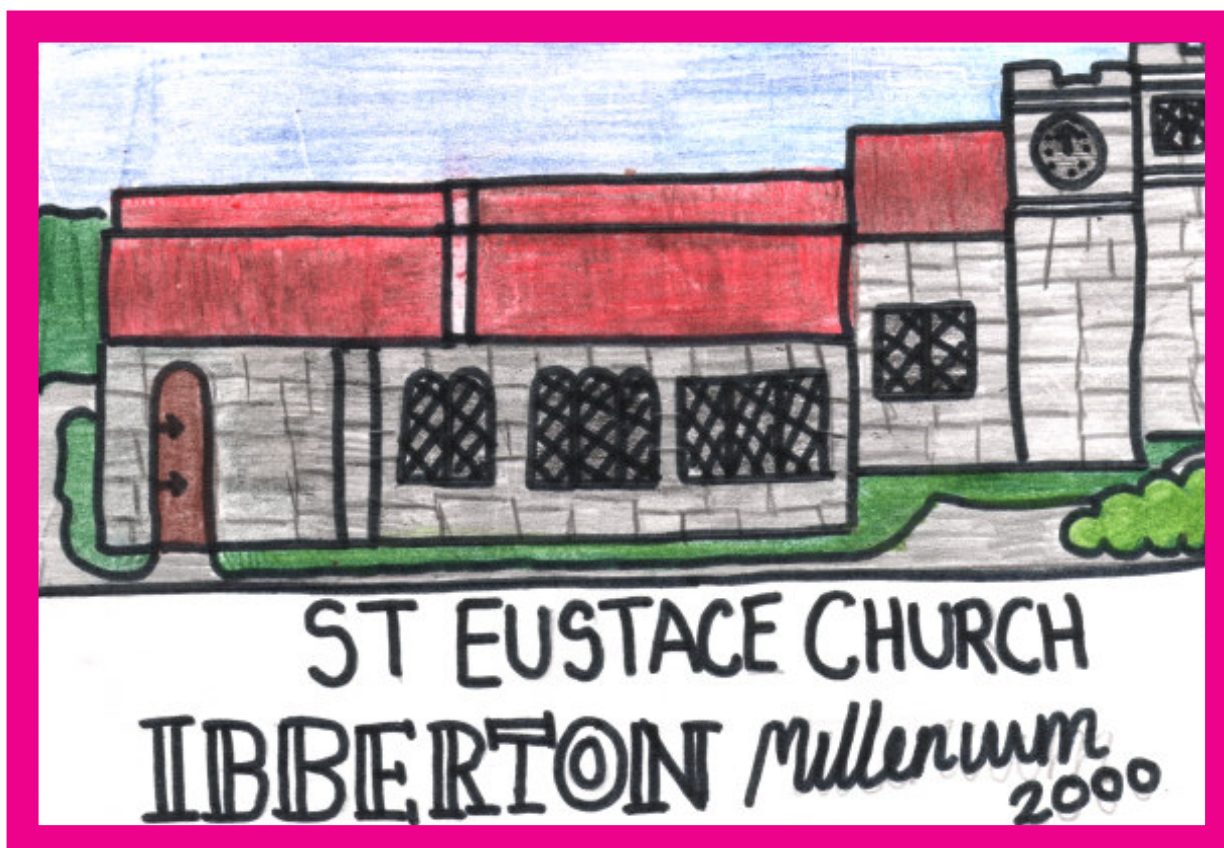
The seat was provided in 1999 with donations from residents and a grant from the Community Project Fund and placed on a stone base prepared by Trevor Fry and Derek Old



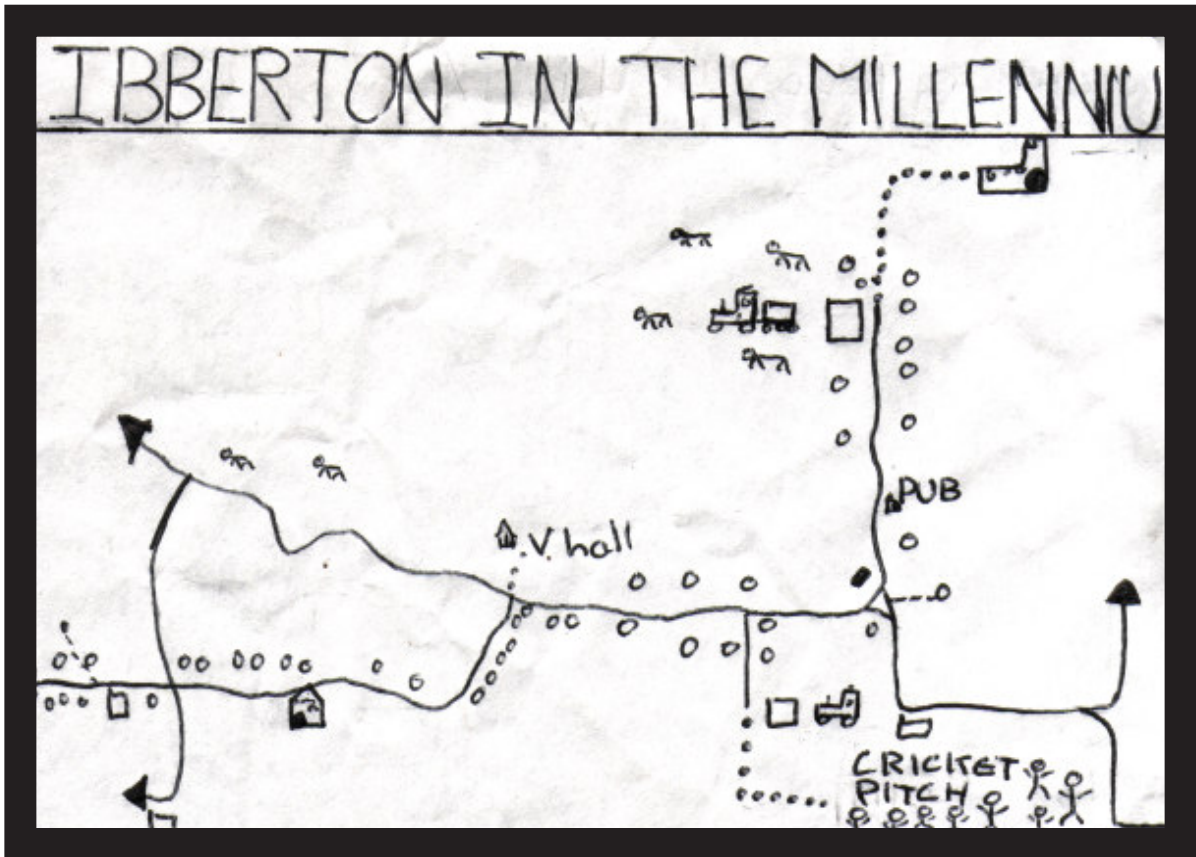

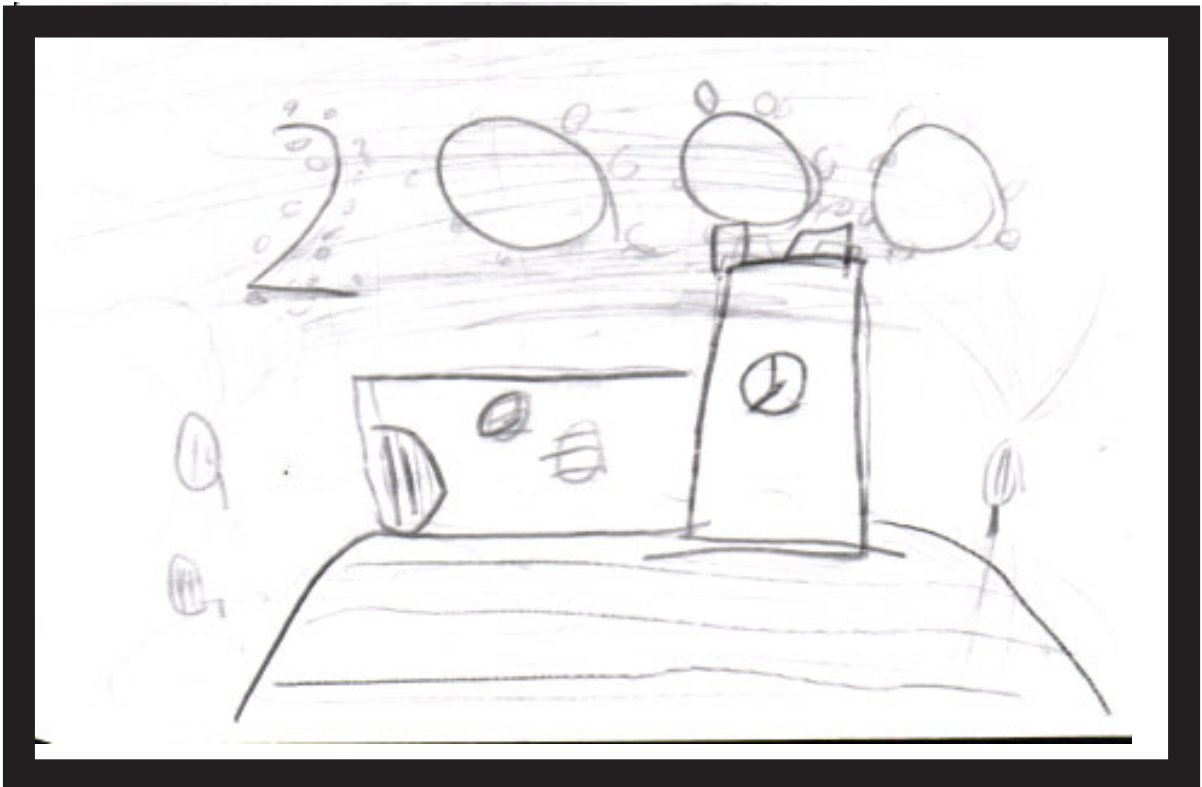
MAP OF IBBERTON BY NICHOLAS OLD OF BELFLYNS

A Ibberton Millennium Mug was presented to all the children in parish under 16yrs of age and the same design was used on Notelets.

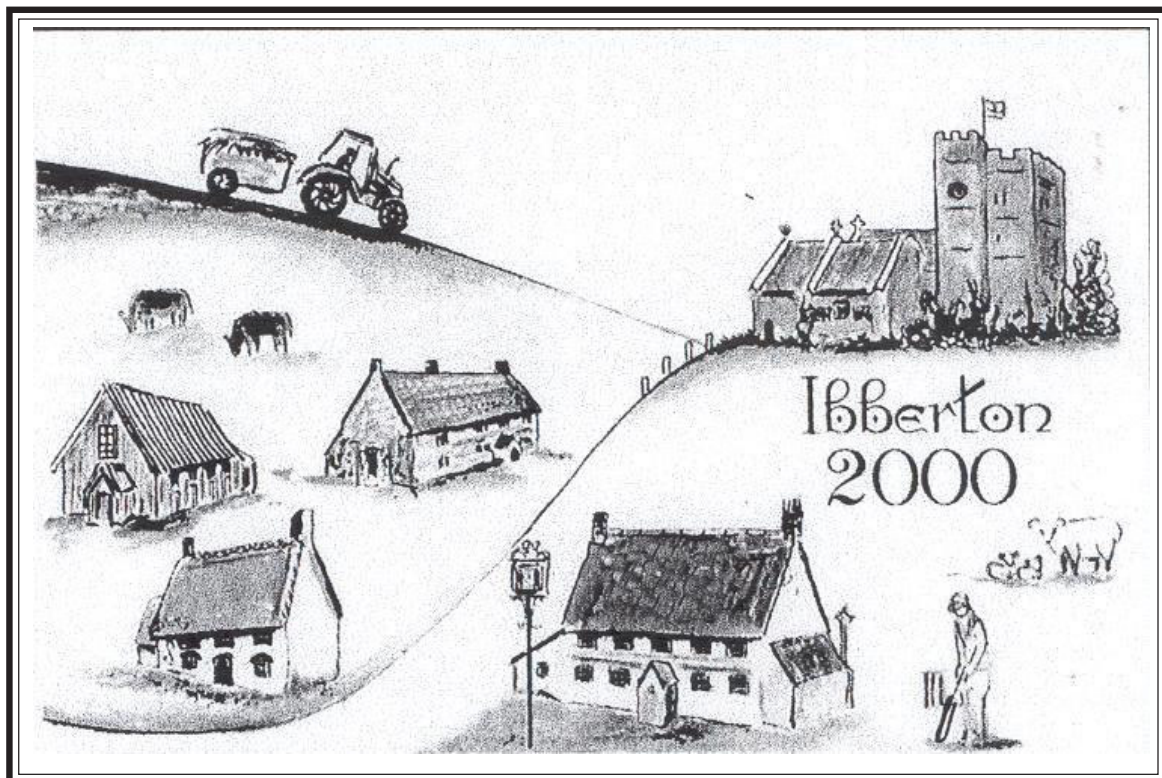


TABLE TOP STALL SALE
