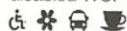

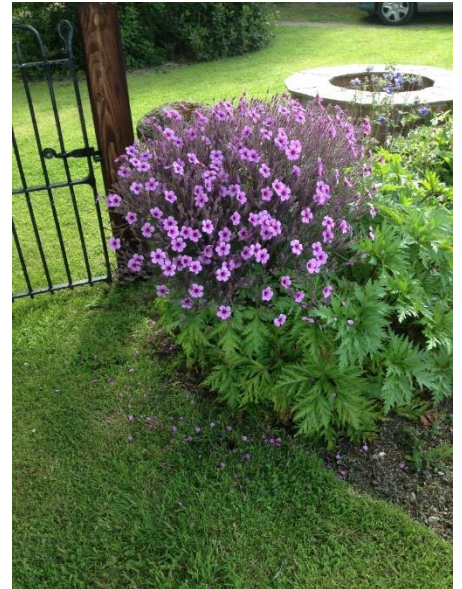

Ibberton Parish Council News

The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council was held on 5th May and Carolne Doran was re-elected as Chairman for the next 12 months. The annual accounts and other annual housekeeping matters like the risk assessment, governance statements etc were approved.

You might have noticed a new "20 is plenty" sign by the village gateway sign as you come into the village from Okeford. This is an informal sign put up by the parish council to try and reduce the speed of traffic coming into the village. It is likely two more will be fitted soon. As things stand there is no chance of a formal 20 mph limit being introduced by Dorset Council.

The Annual Parish Meeting was held a week later on 12th May, the first one for 3 years due to Covid. A total of 19 people attended. The main topics covered were the Ibberton "20:20 Vision" questionnaire results and the provision of a children's play area. Recently a notice board has been installed on the new hall gates. Thank you, Michael Newman, for making and installing it.

Jubilee Tree - after an on line vote the Trustees and Committee chose a Green Walnut tree, *Juglans* - Broadview to be planted within the Halls boundary hedge to commemorate Queen Elizabeth 11's Platinum Jubilee. Thank you, Jason and Freddie, for planting it. It has been recorded on the Queens Canopy Site Map. (The location for all trees is not



accurate to protect possible vandalism or theft) and appropriate plant labels ordered. In the area beneath the tree wild flower seeds from the Eden project Jubilee pack have been planted. Fingers cross they germinate!



Defibrillator update - Unfortunately the defibrillator heating unit lid has broken, the defibrillator is undamaged and usable. The Village Hall has kindly agreed to fund a replacement the lid in a hope to extend the life of the heating unit. The defibrillator was purchased and maintained by an Ibberton Village project under the leadership of Caroline Doran. The village hall was responsible for the installation and on-going electric power. A new outdoor heating unit and install would cost in the region of £650. The on costs include replacing the pads approximately 3 yearly or if used, new battery approximately 5 yearly, the unit has a approximate life of 10 to 15 years - it was purchased in 2015. Ibberton Parish Council are considering how this should be funded in the future.

Recently the Trustees and Committee met to consider Ibberton Parish Councils request to consider a playground being installed within the Hall grounds, on the grassed area by the storage shed. A possible proposal has been sent to Ibberton Parish Council for them to consider.

At the moment the Trustees and Committee are researching a replacement sewage system that will be placed under the grassed area beside the hall.

'All in June'

Next is an extract from Kilvert's Diary. 3rd June 1870.

Very hot in morning church, and an enormous bumble bee crawled over the white cloth and everything else during the Holy Communion. A number of white dresses and light colour in church in honour of Whitsuntide.

Outdoor games we played in June

Skipping games were very popular, mainly with the girls but we all enjoyed the rough and tumble of Sheep, Sheep Come Home.

One child was chosen to be the wolf and stood at the far end of the playground while the rest lined up at the near side. Then we all chanted THE WOLF HAS GONE TO DEVONSHIRE AND WON'T BE BACK FOR MANY A YEAR. SHEEP SHEEP COME HOME.

There was a mad scramble as wolf and sheep changed places with the wolf catching a sheep for his replacement.

Away from the playground there are other things I remember with pleasure. Kay and family at this time were living at Manor Farm.

We cousins would climb to the top of the lynchets behind the house, lie flat, and send ourselves twirling to the bottom of the hill.

Making a chemist shop in the trees behind where is now Debbie's Garden was great fun.

We collected old jars and paint pallets and mixed-up beautiful colours to sell to each other using dock seeds for money.

On rainy days Kay's mum let us play Sardines all over the house. This was especially enjoyable on dark winter nights when, with hearts beating fast, we hid in a wardrobe waiting to be found.

We also played marbles, hoping to win the glass ones, and hop scotch.

The Coronation

Yes, I remember it well - now you know how old I am! What you do not know is I watched it all on television! All the young ones are saying ...'For Sake, didn't everybody? NO because not that many people in 1952 had a T.V., particularly in Woolland.' I lived - grew up - at Mount Pleasant Farm, Woolland, $\frac{1}{2}$ mile up a farm track. No main electricity, no telephone, no mains water supply and certainly no television. BUT...? I had a pony, really, my only means of transport. Father wasn't allowed to use the farm truck for pleasure, i.e., taking his family out in it, even to Stur to a shop, to telephone somebody. I bicycled to Woolland to the kiosk or rode my pony and tied my him to the fence outside.

Anyway, The Coronation- riding mentors who had taken me under their wings Helen Foresliu-Walker (Trotter!) & Doreen Parkes, rented The Crown stables in Blandford - don't laugh - **now** The Sealy Suite!! Where Doreen ran it for the Hunter Liverier and some of Trotters ponies. There I used to ride in their own hunts. I quite often rode my pony to Blandford stabled him in The Crown Stables, stayed the night at Mrs Parkes (as I called her) 29, Dorset Street before maybe going to a show the next day when a lorry collected us for the event.

Father rode with me over the hill to show me the route - he wasn't totally sure himself, but found it. Oh, what a ride, you would not recognise it now. Once you were up Ibberton Hill, it was all old downland turf, gorse and heather, just like the New Forest, no gates or fences, you could just ride. The Ridgeway, Ringmoor over the road and down to Shepherds Corner, Bryanston, Blandford - The Crown Stables! I did it so many times.



So - The Coronations, one of my friends in the Pony Club and another member I saw a lot of Rosemary Cooper who lived in Milldown Road, her parents had a T.V! So... we were all invited to go to watch The Coronation. So, a little ride to Blandford was certainly no problem.

There was quite a roomful of people and Doreen Parkes,

who was quite large and, in the front, as I remember, stood to attention every time they played the National Anthem, which was several times and blocked the view of the T.V.- Oh well...

may we say this



4oz mixed dried fruit
4oz castor Sugar
 $\frac{1}{4}$ pint Hot tea
2 tablespoons marmalade
1 egg
8oz self-raising flour
1 lb loaf tin

Place fruit, sugar and tea into a bowl
Leave to stand for approximately 6 hours or overnight
Add marmalade, egg and flour, mix well
Turn mixture into prepared tin.
Cook at 350 degrees centigrade for 50-60 minutes
Slice and spread with butter, if liked

The Garden May 2022

A very busy time of year in the garden! The perennials are starting to come to life, the peonies flowering and even a few roses in sheltered areas. The trees and shrubs are putting on lots of new growth aided by the combination of hot sunny days and intermittent rain. This also means enormous weed growth so keep these under control, (hoeing annual weeds, removing perennial weeds) as not only are they unsightly taking over the borders, but they take valuable moisture and nutrients from the other plants. If you have an area in the garden that you wish to leave for wildlife, make sure the more thuggish weeds such as brambles and thistles do not take over entirely as diversity is key.

Garden pots and hanging baskets can be filled with bedding and tender annuals planted out, but remember to water on a regular basis and protect from slugs, especially hostas, dahlias and newly planted vegetables- there are many methods of slug control, but try and use products compatible with birds and children! The birds seem to have multiplied this year in our garden and reports from others are the same. Please DO NOT cut your hedges until late August /September when they have stopped nesting, and also be careful around little used areas as you never know where they have set up home- see picture- this was my pot store!!



Ponds will unfortunately be prone to blanket weed when the sun shines and this should be removed as it lowers the oxygen content of the water. Other coverings should be left to give shade and nutrients for the pond life of which there is plenty.

Above all in the garden, take time to enjoy it and those around open to the public at this time of year- I am opening at Manor House Ibberton the weekend of June 18/19th, and there will be plenty to see and a good tea and plant stall afterwards. I have picked up many tips from gardens around!!
