3th March, 2025: Piliers arrive

Drilling rig accends the Church Path (the tipper truck gives a helping hand!) and begins drilling 5.5 metres beside the church – 2 metres before the chalk bedrock is reached! x 2 pilies. Cardboard tube liners filled with concrete.

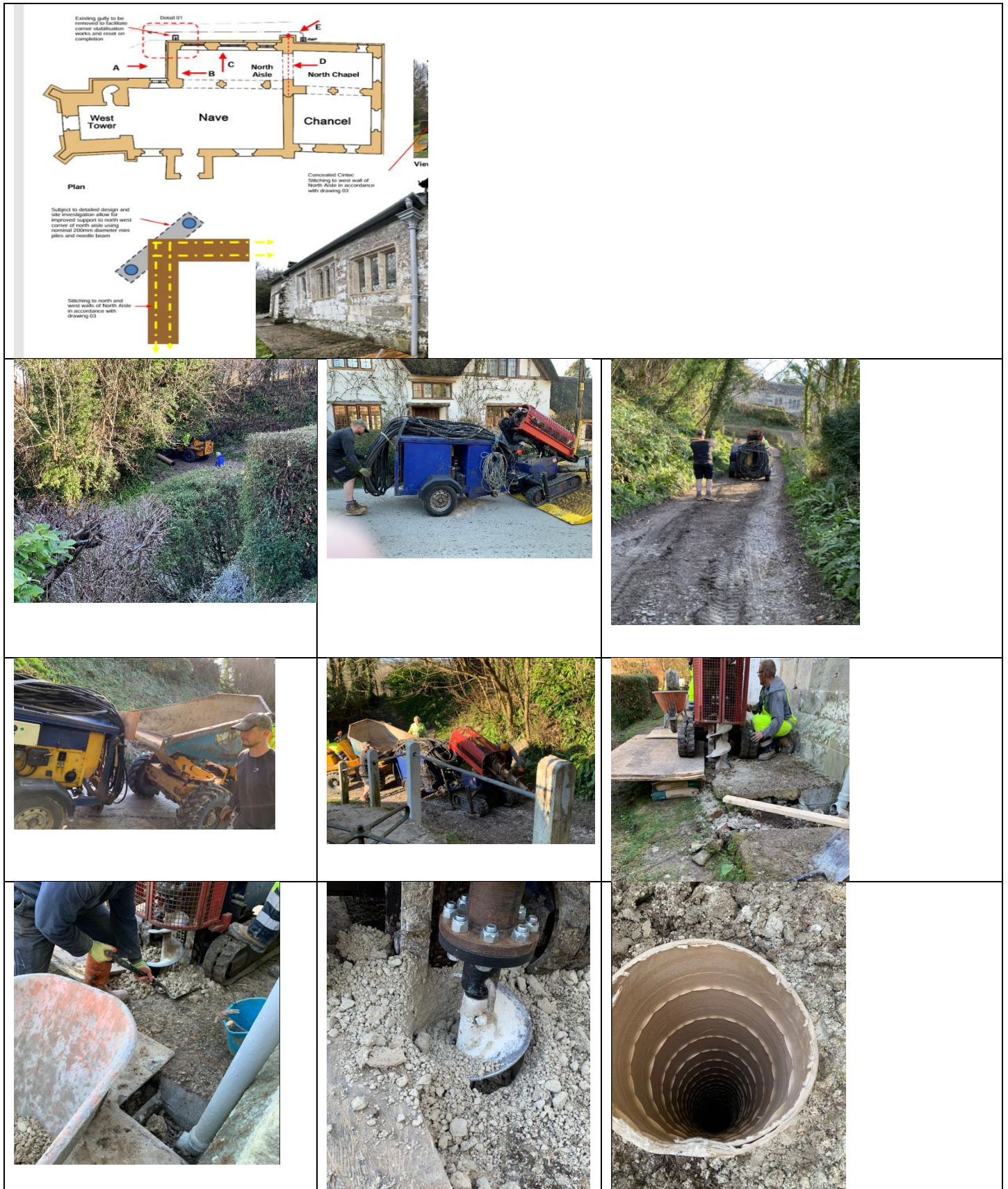
5th March: ground prepared for the concrete beam. Old drains removed – broken and blocked. Below appeared to be a brick soakaway. Existing clay pipe laid on a path of bricks! The ground was very wet and some slow worms, a newt and a toad where released!

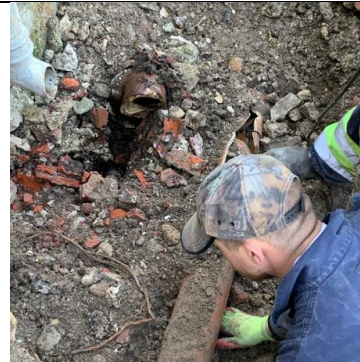
A repair had been undertaken to the side of the North Aisle with a mixture of flints, chalk and broken bricks set in a very strong mortar to the depth of 50 cms / ½ a metre.

6th March: installation of the concrete beam under the corner of the church. Acro props where installed under the North Aisle west corner. The church is resting on solid chalk. A cage of metal was constructed and treaded through the acro props on to a corrugated cardboard platform covered with polythene as shuttered with corriflute. The trench beside was backfilled. Finally concrete was poured in and tampered.

7th March: Clearing up and laying new plastic drains.

Without a tipper truck, drilling machine and a digger this job would have taken a great deal of time and energy especially ascending and descending the Church Path. The workmen mentioned how well they had slept with all the walking up and down!









Church services will take place on the same day and times but in the Village Hall instead, as they did 120 years ago before the church was restored in the early 1900's. The contractors will also be using part of the village hall car park to store materials within a locked compound.

Church Electoral Roll 2025



NOTICE OF PREPARATION OF NEW ROLL

DIOCESE OF

Salisbury

PARISH OF

Ibberton

Notice is given that under the Church Representation Rules a new Church Electoral Roll* is being prepared. Every person who wishes to have his or her name entered on the new Roll, whether it is entered on the present Roll or not, is requested to apply for enrolment not later than:

11th April, 2025

The new Roll will take effect on 13th April, 2025

The new Roll will be published by the Parochial Church Council [on the church door] for at least 14 days and a copy of the Roll will be available for inspection on a reasonable request being made to the Council.

Under the Church Representation Rules, a lay person is entitled to have his or her name entered on the roll, if the person –

- (a) is baptised,
- (b) is aged 16 or over, and
- (c) has made one of the following three declarations and duly applied for enrolment.

The first declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it and is resident in the parish.

The second declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it, is not resident in the parish, but has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months.

The third declaration is that the person is a member in good standing of a Church which is not in communion with the Church of England but subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and is also a member of the Church of England and has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months.

Application Forms for enrolment can be obtained from the Church Electoral Roll Officer. In order to be entitled to attend the annual parochial church meeting and to take part in its proceedings, you must return the Application Form for enrolment by the earlier of the dates given above.

Any error discovered in the roll should at once be reported to the Church Electoral Roll Officer.

* The new roll must be completed at least 15 days, but no more than 28 days, before the Annual Parochial Church Meeting.

Every 6 years the Church is required to renew the whole electoral roll – 2025 is such a year. Everyone who wishes to be on the Church Electoral roll is required to renew their declaration. The forms are available from Ibberton, Belchalwell & Woolland Village Hall website Link for electronic form

They will need to be handed in / returned via email/ posted into Woolland View, Ibberton front door before Friday 11th April, 2025. All members are able to attend the Annual Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 29th April at 7.00 pm and to elect the Churchwardens, Deanery Synod representatives and Parochial Church Council (PCC)
The Church Accounts and Annual report will be available to view on Sunday 20th April in the church and from the website page mentioned above.

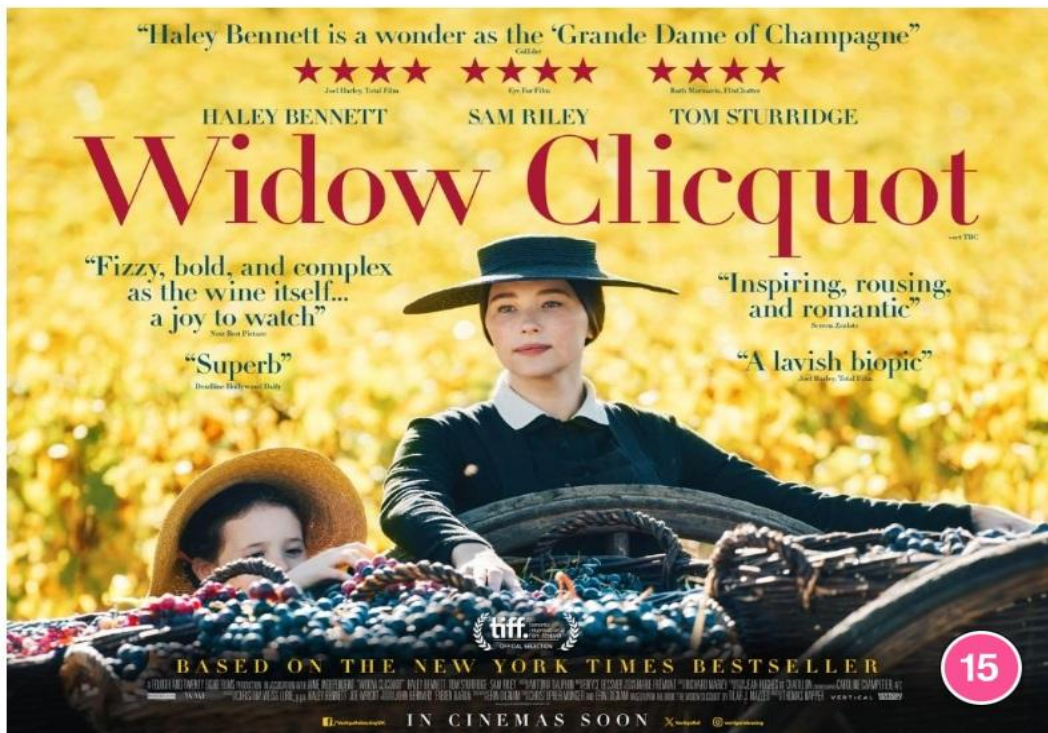
Twelfth Night – Shakespeare’s joyous, chaotic comedy, where love knows no boundaries!

Hello. My name is Sarah and I have studied Flamenco for nearly twenty years. In April 2025, I am starting a new flamenco-based exercise class at Ibberton village hall. This is NOT a flamenco 'dance' class (true flamenco is incredibly demanding and impossible for the average person to learn) but my class will focus on the techniques and exercises that flamenco dancers use as a warm-up for their performances. These exercises are important in their own right!

Flamenco- exercise benefits:

1)Core stability

Flamenco-exercise is unbeatable for posture. You must maintain a long, straight spine, shoulders back, tail bone tucked under and the core-stability muscles around the middle pulled in and up.

2)Upper-body and lower-body strength

The exercises focus on bringing your arms above your head moving them in graceful twists and sweeps. This develops long, lean muscles in the arms and shoulders. Also, the legs need to be strong with flamenco without becoming bulky, so there are exercises to improve and build up the leg muscles and glutes. These stronger leg muscles will protect your ankle and knee joints and keep you mobile.

3) Beating osteoporosis

Weight-bearing exercise is key in helping to prevent this bone disease. The stamping movements and travelling steps of flamenco-exercise is classed as 'medium-impact' and can boost bone density. There is no pressure on the knee joints or jumping involved.

4) Mind/body connection

Flamenco as a dance form is highly co-ordinated and the exercises are no different. The movements involve the whole body and 'cross the midbrain' which is known to reinforce neural pathways. There are many recent studies proving how dance is one of the best ways to improve neural connections in the brain (especially highly co-ordinated movements).

5) Self control.

Flamenco is very disciplined, so preparation, posture, breathing and correct attention to one's body is very important. This helps with a sense of mind/body control, almost in a zen-like way and can be incorporated into one's daily life to help deal with stress. We will be learning how to connect with the ground for support, to use the breath to provide both calmness and energy, and learn to 'release' tension in the muscles.

6) In my exercise class, I also teach pain management and pain awareness, particularly for menopausal/older women.

7) Delight

Yes, despite being 'exercise', these flamenco movements bring much personal joy and satisfaction because you are learning something new and challenging. If you get bitten by the flamenco bug it is hard to give up!



Stretch and Tone is a workout which has Yoga and Pilates to help you to improve flexibility, build strength and tone your body, you'll leave class feeling relaxed and calm. The practice lasts for 45 mins, so come along and give it a try! There are loads of options so don't worry about your ability, just do what you can and enjoy your workout!
