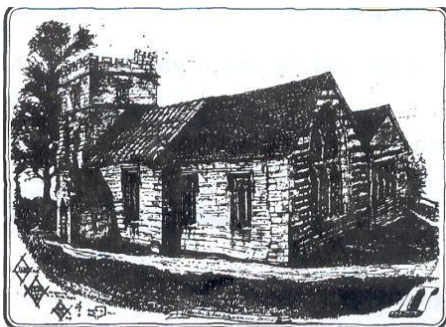

'The original parts of the church, still standing, date back to the 15th century. The North Aisle, overlooking the Blackmore Vale, was added in the 16th century and features two rare examples of Elizabethan stained glass. After falling into complete disrepair, the church was restored and brought back into use in around 1903. Today the church has two services a month and continues to be an important asset to our village community.'

Arthur Miller
and
Augusta Ina Lucy Vater



Arthur Miller was born on 24th February 1883 in Ibberton. His parents were Herbert Miller and Mahala Cross, and he was the fourth child of six. The Millers originated in the Woolland and Hilton areas, whereas the Cross line goes back in Ibberton as far back as the 1770s. Arthur was a shepherd and small holder like his father before him.

Augusta Ina Lucy (known as Lucy) was born on 27th March 1882 in Ibberton. Her parents were Samuel Vater and Harriet Augusta Wells, and she was the eighth of ten children. The Vater line can be traced in Ibberton back to the early 1700s. The Wells line can be traced back in Turnworth and Winterborne Houghton to a similar date.

Arthur and Lucy married on November 18th 1909 in Ibberton Church. They had four children - Lenoard, Kathleen, Rosie and William - and the family lived at Lower Leigh before taking on the tenancy of Kitford Farm in the 1920s. Then, when Arthur was nearing retirement, he built The Bungalow at Leigh for him and Lucy to live in. Their youngest child, Will, remained in Ibberton for all his life, and is also buried in Ibberton churchyard. Kathleen married Walter 'Chesley' Evers (my parents) and they lived in Sturminster Newton.

On November 18th 1970, Arthur and Lucy celebrated 61 years of marriage. Not long after, on 25th November, Lucy died aged 88 years. Arthur died on 24th May 1973 just three months after his 90th birthday.

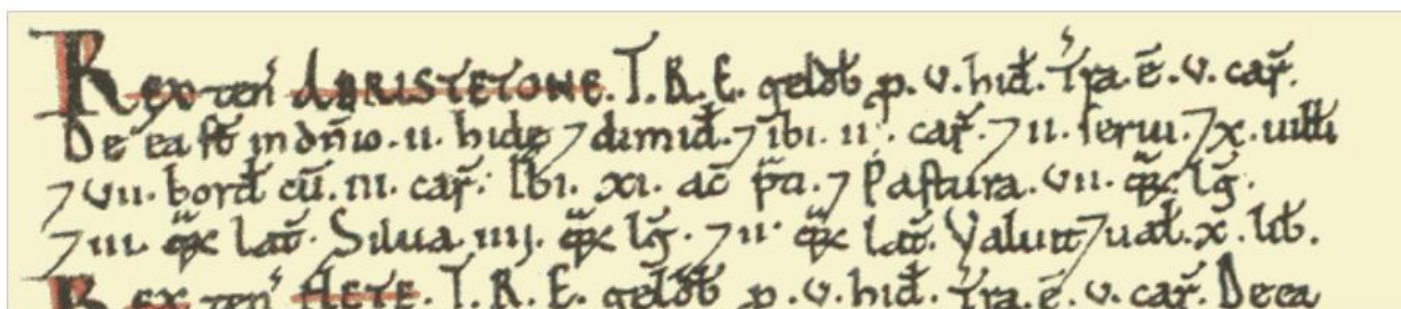

It had a recorded population of 19 households in 1086.

Land of King William Households: 10 villagers. 7 smallholders. 2 slaves.

Land and resources Ploughland: 5 ploughlands. 2 lord's plough teams. 3 men's plough teams.

Other resources: 2.5 lord's lands. Meadow 11 acres. Pasture 7 * 3 furlongs. Woodland 4 * 2 furlongs.

Livestock in 1086: 2 cobs. 4 cows. 10 pigs. 50 sheep. 50 goats.

Valuation: Annual value to lord: 10 pounds in 1086; 10 pounds when acquired by the 1086 owner.

Lord in 1086: King William.

Lord in 1066: Earl Harold.
