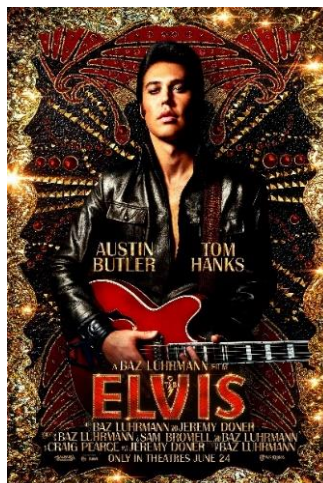

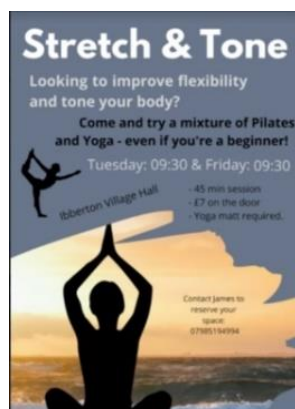

The Garden October 2022

With a beautiful autumn, the gardens are breathing a sigh of relief after some rain. This is a good time to assess your garden and make changes if necessary. Apples are ready to be harvested and crumbles abound with the combination of blackberries in the hedgerows.



In the flower beds, spent perennials that have fallen over

can be cut down, but it is better to leave a few so the birds can harvest the seeds over winter. New perennials /shrubs/hedges and trees can be planted now whilst the soil is still relatively warm to encourage root growth before the winter. Take cuttings of tender plants such as salvias and

penstemons now in case the main plant is lost in the frost. Tender plants such a non-hardy geranium should be brought into greenhouses or sheds to overwinter.

Daffodil, crocus and iris bulbs can be planted now, but leave tulip bulbs until November when it is colder. Forced or prepared hyacinth bulbs can also be planted up now for a display at Christmas, but keep in the dark until the first foliage appears.

If you have a greenhouse, the seed of half-hardy annuals can be sown now and left to overwinter in a cold frame - this gives stronger healthier plants and in the case of sweet peas much longer stem length.

Leaves can be collected now to make leaf mould which will benefit your beds next year.

In the vegetable garden, tomatoes can either be brought in to ripen or made into chutney.

Keep picking runner beans until the first frost and lift beetroot. Sow winter salads directly in the soil and plant hardy onions.

Ponds should be cleared of leaves and other debris. Keep mowing the grass at a higher level until it becomes too wet or it stops growing, to make it easier for the first spring cut.

Any meadows or wildflowers should also have been cut down and the thatch removed.

Hedgerow Jelly (Jam)

Preparation and cooking time Total time 2 hrs Plus overnight straining

Ingredients

- a variety fruit from the hedgerow or garden: blackberries, elderberries, sloes, damsons, wild plums, haws, rosehips.
- an equal weight of either cooking or crab apples
- Sugar: preserving or cane,
1lb (500g) per 1 pint (600ml) juice

Spice can be added for extra flavour

Method

- 1 Wash and pick over the fruit, discarding any that are damaged
- 2 Wash and cut up the apples, cutting out any bruises. Don't peel or core them
- 3 Put all into a preserving pan with a little water and simmer until soft and its mostly juice
- 4 Put into a jelly bag and strain overnight
- 5 Measure the juice (n.b. Don't squeeze the jelly bag or the result will be cloudy)
- 6 Return to the pan and add 1lb (500g) per 1pt (600ml) of juice and allow to dissolve over a low heat.
- 7 Boil rapidly until setting point is reached. (A knob of butter helps get rid of any scum)
- 8 Put into sterilised jars, cover and label.
- 9 Enjoy on toast, scones, rice pudding; with cold meat; or in a sauce for venison or pork
