Ibberton Parish Council News

A Note from the Chairman

Many of you will have heard that the Parish Council is currently facing difficulties and I want to tell you what has happened and where we are now. The Parish survey, which we held a few years ago, told us that the most popular practical project we could do is to create a children's playground in our village, similar to those enjoyed in many of our neighbouring villages. Ibberton PC has very little money. We try to keep the local council tax to a minimum and the £750 or so which we receive each year seemed to put any such project quite out

of reach. However, Malcom Wilson our Parish Clerk, found several sources of funding exceeding £20,000 which would cover the costs without any call on our precept. Unfortunately, because of individual and institutional objections and difficulties raised about sites we had identified; we were unable to follow through with the plans. We had to return the considerable sums already paid to us, a decision so disagreeable that both our Chair and our Parish Clerk felt that they no longer wished to continue in office.

The Ibberton Parish Council answers only to you, our constituents, and then to the County Council and to Parliament. It is a basic building block in preserving our democratic rights. I feel so strongly that we cannot allow the Parish Council to lapse and so give up these rights that I have agreed to act as Chairman and keep the institution alive, even though some have asked the valid question "Why should we continue in the light of what has happened?"

I and my colleague councillors promise you that we will do all that we can to protect and promote the interests of all of us who live in the village, recognising the position of those who have differing personal or institutional interests but trying to act to reflect the interests of our community as a whole.

We continue to try to find a way to provide a playground.

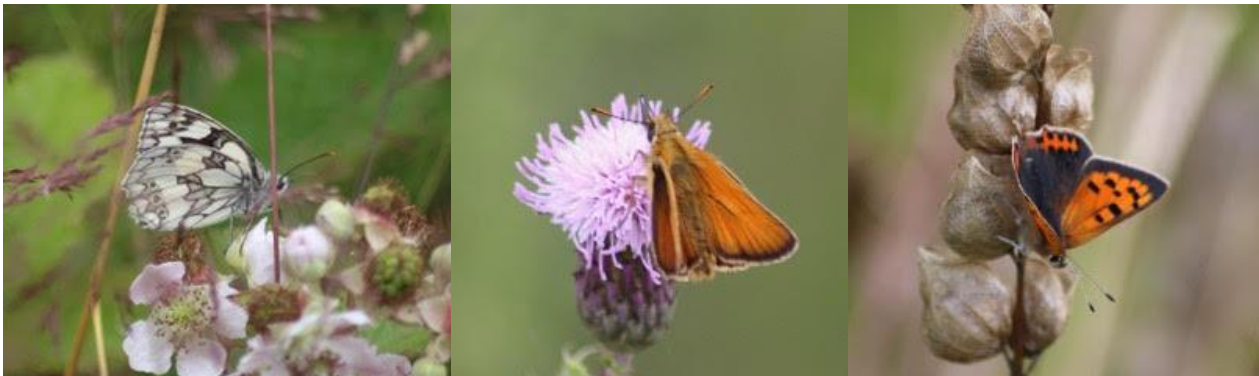

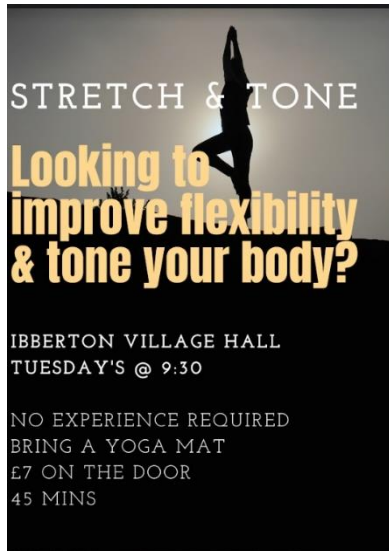
